Superintendent Report

The Crowley Academy of Aviation, Transportation and Logistics (C-ATL) is working to expand female participation in aviation programs. Its first step is forming a girls group to expose students to careers and offer networking opportunities for internships, mentorships as well as scholarship opportunities.

On Saturday, Sept. 24, the program is taking 20 to 25 middle school and high school girls to the Girls in Aviation Day in Dallas. The Crowley Academy of Aviation, Transportation and Logistics focuses on five different CTE Programs of Study: Aviation Maintenance, Distribution and Logistics, UAV/UAS, Aviation Flight and Computer Programming. Scholars who graduate from C-ATL would have not only earned their high school diploma, but have the potential to earn either a Level 1 Certification, Level 2 Certification or an Associate's Degree from Tarrant County College, which is transferable to a senior college/university or leading to employment.
