Why CMAR as Delivery Method?



- Transfers the risk of project cost overruns to the contractor from the School District
 - CMAR presents a Guaranteed Maximum Price

- CMAR is engaged much earlier in the design process
 - acts as a consultant in the design phase reviewing architectural drawings
 - Can assist in value engineering (more cost effective solutions)


