



1:1 Middle School Chromebooks Cart RFP & Purchase

December 15, 2022



Current

- Middle school students take home devices

Findings

- Fewer than 75% of students bring devices daily
- Middle school students make up 22% of the student population, but account for nearly 50% for Chromebook tickets
- Middle school campus leadership survey indicates a strong preference for a return to in-class 1:1 devices

Moving Forward

- 1:2 ratio – 1 Chromebook cart for every 2 core teachers
- 2 Chromebook carts per middle school library for student checkout
- 2022-2023
 - all students will continue to take home devices as carts are added to classrooms
- 2023-2024
 - carts in classrooms with devices available for checkouts
 - previous take-home devices redistributed to 39 additional carts and put back in middle school classrooms
 - Remaining devices to high school for new students and students with broken devices

- Online STAAR testing
- Online benchmark testing
- Use of adaptive software programs to close achievement gaps / unfinished learning
- Availability of use for daily instruction
- Continue to have devices available for checkout
- Reduce breakage, fines & fees at MS (similar to elementary)
