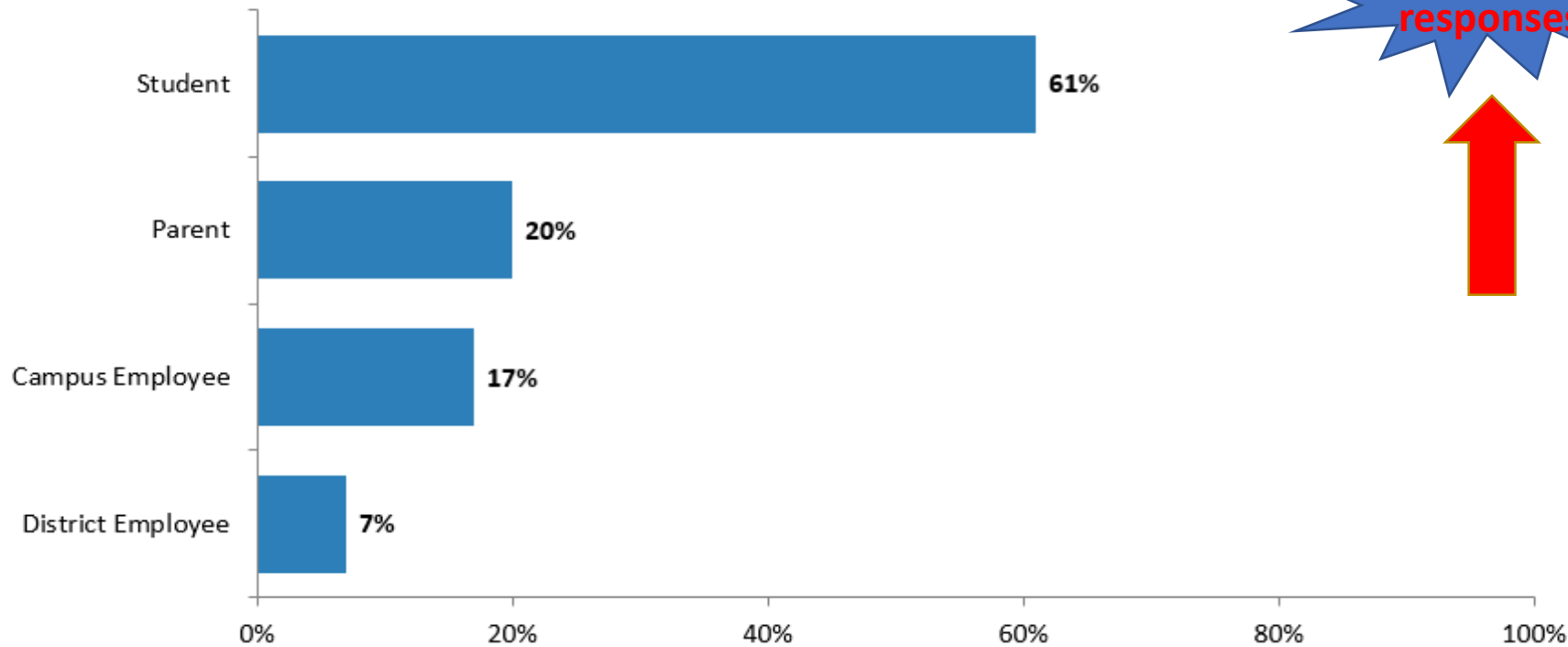

- Safety Survey was open to all stakeholders 5/12/23 – 6/1/23

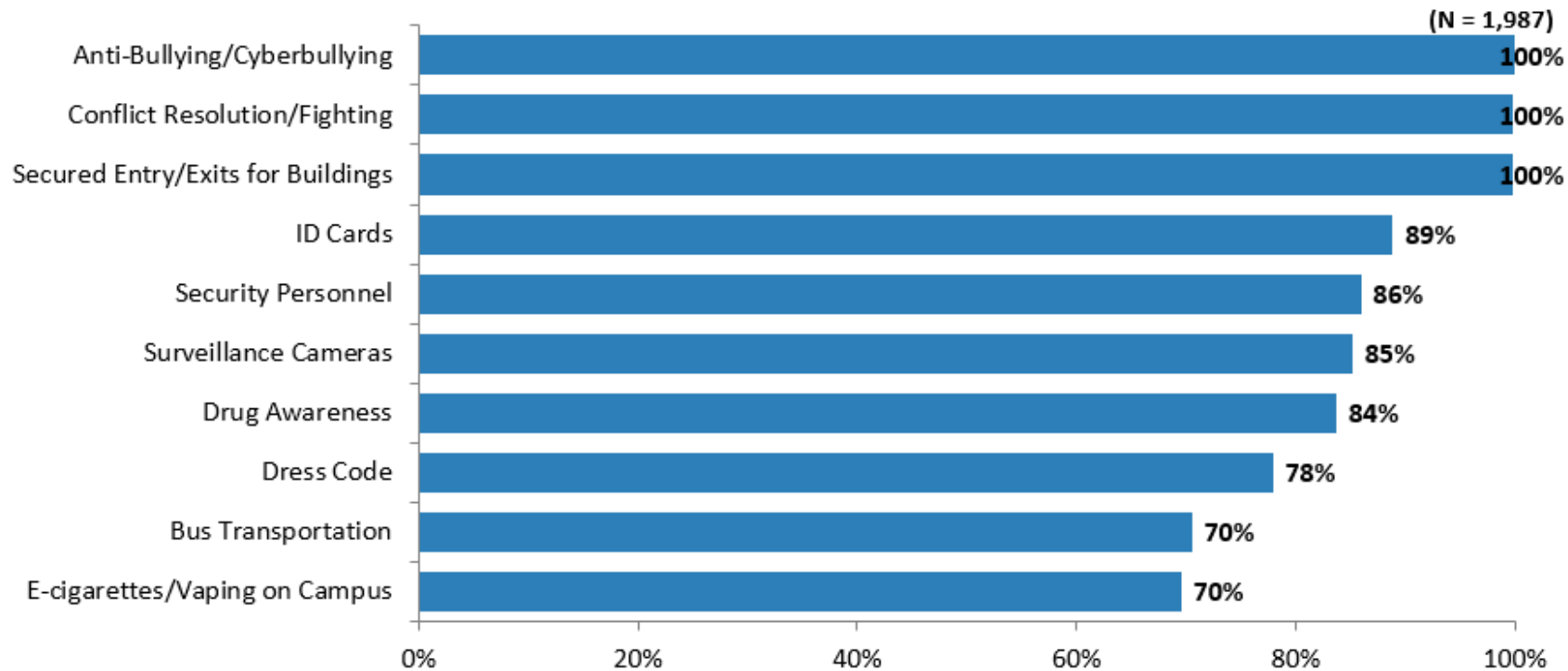
What is your role in Crowley ISD?

- Top 3 areas of importance: Bullying, Conflicts/Fighting, Campus Entry/Exit

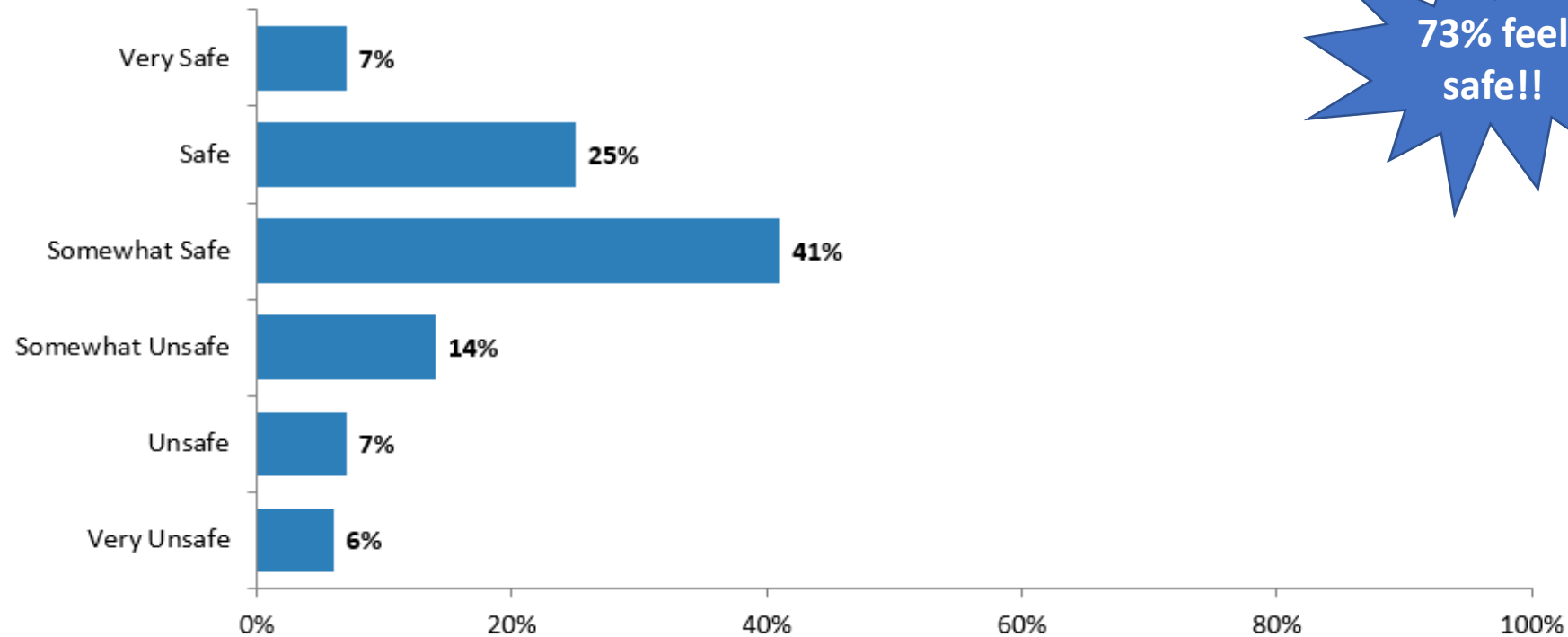
Rank the areas you would focus on in order of importance if you were in charge of school safety on your campus or your child's campus.

➤ Safety perception

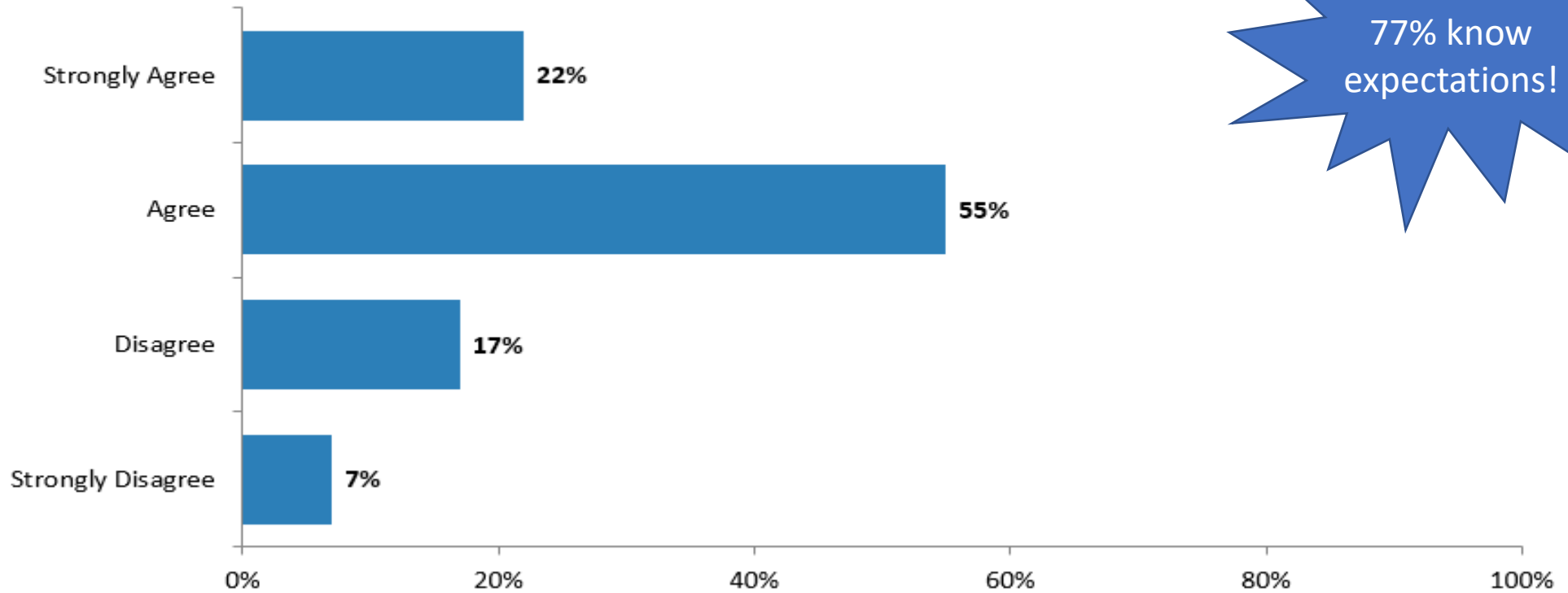
How safe do you feel in your school? How safe do you feel your child is at school?

➤ Do students know expectations?

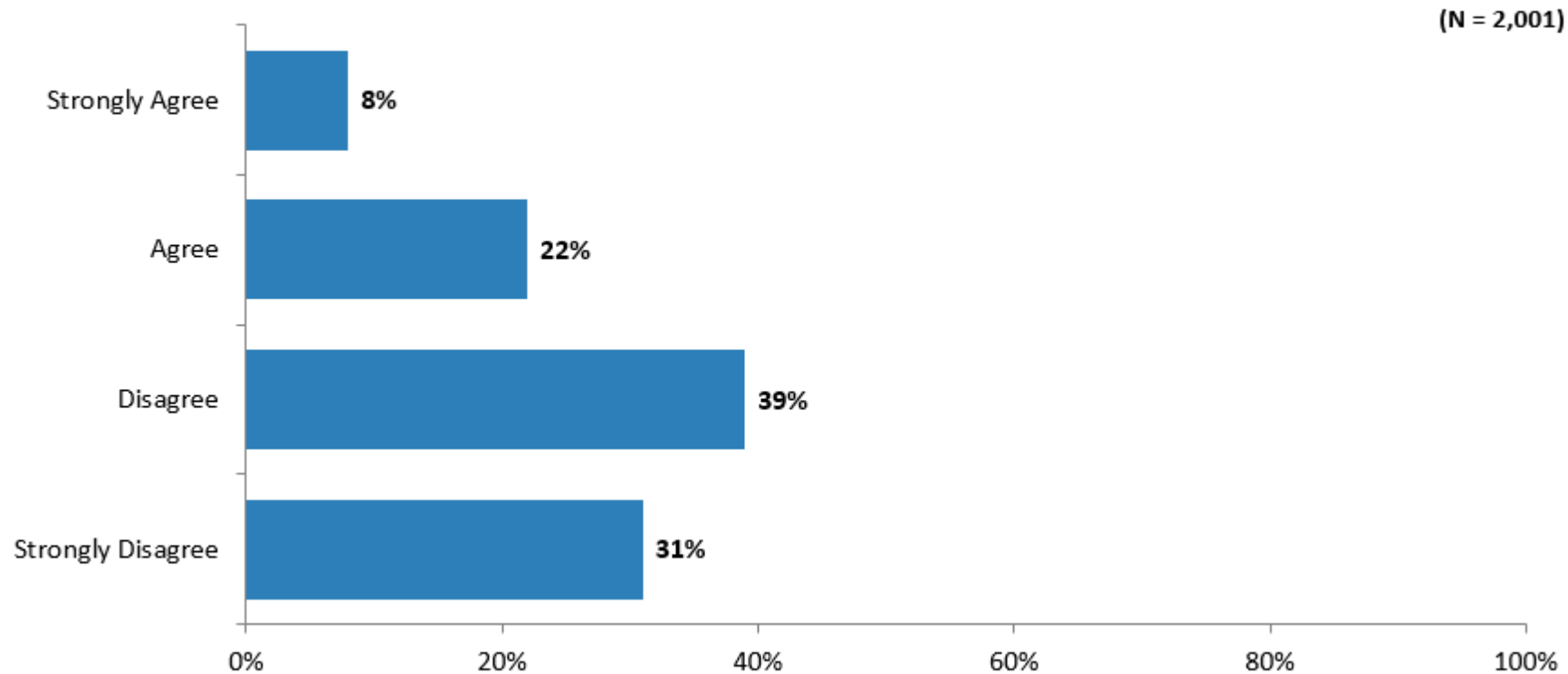
My school/my child's school has clearly identified and communicated student behavior expectations and procedures with students, staff and parents.

➤ Dress code as a safety concern

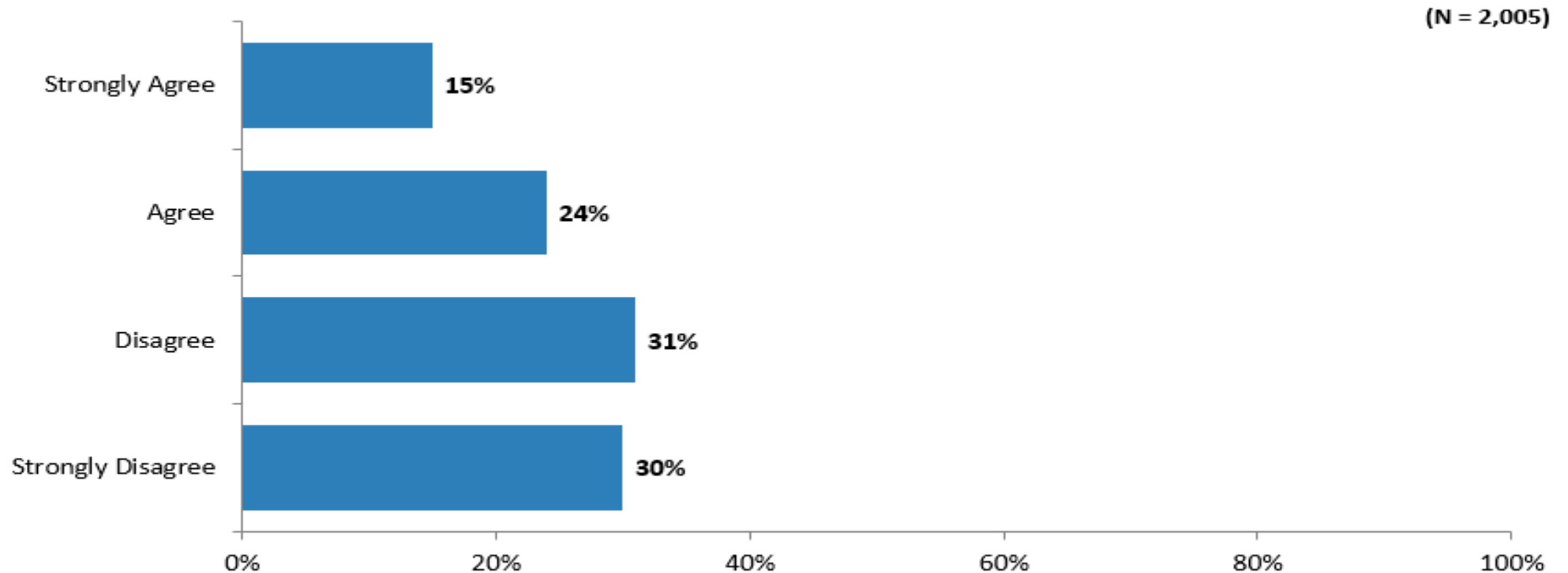
It is a safety concern when a student is out of dress code.

NEXUS TEAM PROGRESS



- Rationale for dress expectations aligned to safety and/or social distraction
- Enforcement expectations
- Secondary alignment 6-12 dress code and PK-5 standardized dress



- Bullying investigation consistency following flow chart through Assistant Principal training.
- Development of communication templates for parents pre and post investigation
- Development of protocols for support of bully victim and perpetrator
- Student led Anti-Bullying initiative



- Development of pre-placement checklist for discretionary persistent misbehavior DAEP recommendations
- Aligning seat assignments at secondary based on enrollment
- Centralized due process hearings

STEERING COMMITTEE PROGRESS



- More specificity in dress code policy
- Enforcement expectations when students are out of dress code
- Professional dress code for Staff defined and enforced
- Positive reinforcement efforts to motivate dress code adherence
- Safety Team recommendations
