Dr. McFarland noted that there are only two weeks of school remaining in the 2022-2023 Crowley ISD school year and thanked all parents for entrusting the district with their children. Additionally, he thanked the Board for allowing him the opportunity to serve alongside of the CISD Administrative staff. Dr. McFarland stated, "Up to this point, it has been an amazing school year and I truly believe the best is yet to come." He added, "The vision and foresight has been realized in Crowley ISD and our stakeholders spoke in one voice saying "excellence for all" as the \$1.04 billion-dollar Bond Election passed."

Dr. McFarland thanked the CISD community and the Board of Trustees for all of their support. In light of recent acts of violence that have occurred throughout our country as well as, within the state of Texas, Dr. McFarland asked for a moment of silence to reflect upon the lives and families impacted by the tragedy that occurred at the outlet mall in Allen, Texas on May 6, 2023.
