### **CCMR Accountability**





- **40%** STAAR
- 40% College, Career, Military Ready (CCMR)
- 20% Graduation Rates

All graduating senior **must** complete at least one of the following:

- Meet TSI criteria in ELA/reading *and* mathematics on assessments or complete college prep courses
- Meet AP/IB criteria
- Earn dual credits
- Earn an approved industry-based certification
- Earn an associate degree
- Graduate with a completed IEP and workforce readiness
- Earn a Level 1 or Level 2 certificate
- Complete an OnRamps dual enrollment course
- Graduate under an advanced diploma plan and be identified as a current special education student
- Complete a CTE coherent sequence of courses (new for 2022-23)

Covers any remaining tuition costs after Pell grants and/or other federal, state, or institutional aid have been applied. In other words, last dollar scholarships cover the gap – any last dollars needed to cover student's tuition. Does **not** cover housing, books, and other fees. \*Income Threshold Required for All

## T3 First Dollar Scholarships\*


First dollar scholarships are applied before any other financial aid is applied and disbursed directly to the student through their bank account, not through their university. The amount does not change even if the student receives other state, federal, or institutional aid. \*Income Thresholds Required for All

#### \$500 Per Year = \$2,000 Total
